The basic equipment list refers to the list of basic equipment that must be available in the Object in order to meet SkiStar's rental standards. The Object must be adapted to the number of guests corresponding to the number of beds in the Object Description, as described below. The Object must also have the functions and capacity that a guest can expect from the equipment that the Object has in accordance with the Object Description. The number of beds that can be sold in the Object is determined by SkiStar based on the Object's conditions

	The kitchen/dining area of the Object must have at least the same number of seats as the number beds the lodging (including any extra beds).
